

To be eligible for admission consideration
☐ Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher.
☐ Complete all prerequisites with a C (2.0) or higher.
☐ View an Allied Health Information Session (<u>www.wvc.edu/alliedhealth</u>).
☐ Achieve the required minimum subject scores for the Test of Essential Academic Skills (<u>www.wvc.edu/teas</u>).
$\ \square$ You must be 18 years of age or older by the start of the program.
☐ Proof of completion of a nursing assistant training course or a current WA state NA-C License (<u>www.wvc.edu/cna</u>).
<u>Prerequisites</u>
Check course descriptions because some courses have prerequisites (see second page for a sequencing chart). Start by
taking the courses you placed into. If you are a transfer student, talk to a College Navigator to determine which courses


Nursing Prerequisite & Corequisite Sequencing


