## CNA TRAINING

### CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANT (CNA) FAST-TRACK

The nursing assistant program at WVC provides the basics in caregiving skills for entry-level employment in healthcare: Instruction of personal care skills, roles and responsibilities of nursing assistants, communication skills, safety and emergency procedures, and CPR and first aid training for healthcare providers. Upon successful completion and evaluation by nursing faculty, students are eligible to take the certification examination for nursing assistants. This course, or its equivalent, is a prerequisite for the Wenatchee Valley College Nursing Program. Attendance is mandatory for all course elements.

# PARKING

Parking permits can be obtained at the cashier's office in Wenatchi Hall. Parking permits are registered to the purchaser. Permits must be hung from the vehicle's rear-view mirror or on the driver's side dashboard with permit information visible from exterior of vehicles.

Standard vehicle permit rates:

**STUDENT:** \$25/quarter or \$70/year (non-refundable)

**EVENING-ONLY:** \$15/quarter

**DAILY:** \$2.00/day

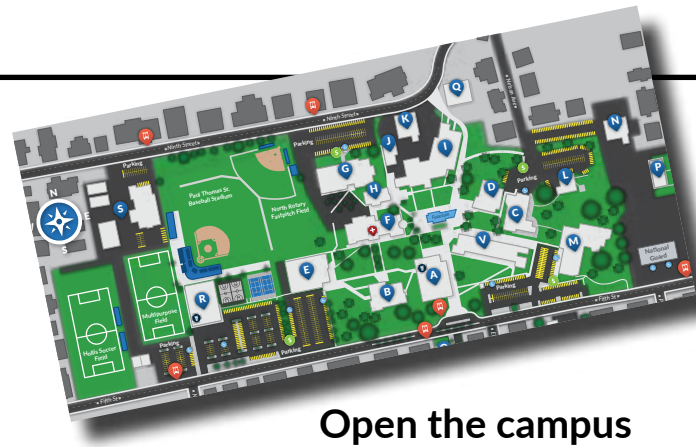
**SENIOR STUDENT** (60 or older): \$5/quarter

Daily permits are available from machines in the parking lots at Smith Gym, Sexton Hall, Brown Library and the Music and Art Center. The machines accept coins, bills and debit/credit cards.

Discounts for electric or hybrid vehicles are available. To qualify, drivers need to bring their state-issued vehicle registration showing that they have a hybrid or electric vehicle.

## FREE PARKING

WVC again has teamed up with the Armory and West Side High School to provide free parking. These areas are on the east side of the Armory and portions of West Side High. All of these are first come first served and are subject to closure for agency events that require parking space.
