



#### Discussion

What are our representation gaps?

► How do we identify impactful candidates?

What qualities (other than fulfilling basic expectations) should candidates have?

#### **Example from Edmonds**

- 1. **Personal or Professional Connection to the College Mission:** Candidates who have attended, supported, or collaborated with the college, or who have had family members benefit from its programs, often bring a deeper understanding and personal commitment.
- 2. **Professional Expertise in Relevant Fields:** Seek members with skills that directly support the board's goals—such as finance, law, marketing, education, or nonprofit management. These members can contribute directly to board operations and strategic initiatives.
- 3. Community Influence and Network: Individuals with strong local connections, like business owners who hire college graduates, civic leaders, or active members of professional networks, can extend the college's reach and foster partnerships.
- 4. Advocates for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion: Candidates committed to creating equitable educational opportunities will help advance the board's mission and broaden its perspective.
- 5. **Passion for Student Success:** Seek those who are deeply invested in the community's future and who want to help students succeed, such as former educators or mentors, advocates for career readiness, and champions of accessible education.
- 6. **Strategic Thinkers and Problem-Solvers:** Individuals who demonstrate forward-thinking and are energized by addressing complex challenges can help drive innovation and adaptability on the board.




- Funds of \$3,007,769.28 received in November 2024

#### Office Move

- ▶ The foundation will move to Knights Hall A on February 5, 2025
- An open house to introduce the new space will be scheduled later
- Why are we moving?
  - Easily located
  - Convenient parking for guests
  - Functional office space for all employees (currently only 4 workstations)
  - Dedicated conference room for meetings and small events
  - New "alumni lounge" to recognize graduates and display memorabilia
  - Consolidated storage space (currently spread across 6 locations)



#### **Business Sponsorship Goals**

- 1. Board members make solicitations made by November 29.
  - 1. Sponsorship deadlines are a ways out, Lupe will be following up.
- 2. 100% of board members (15 members) make an ask.
